  - Used by stores
  - Used by FEMA
- DEC declined the invitation to speak to the Council about Quasar
  - ECEMC is going to extend an invitation to Cornell Cooperative Extension to speak on the Quasar subject
- DEC retracted the statement on the permit issued for Quasar
