**RESOLUTION 2016-19 AUTHORIZATION FOR EMERGENCY REPAIRS TO THE
BOSTON HIGHWAY GARAGE**

Councilman Boardway presented the following resolution and moved for its adoption:

WHEREAS, the Boston Town Highway Garage suffered severe damage to its roof in the November storm of 2014, and

WHEREAS, FEMA (Federal Emergency Management Agency) has determined that the damage to the Boston Town Highway Garage Roof is substantial and in need of immediate repair/restoration and has allocated \$115,300 to the Town of Boston for such repairs/restoration and,

WHEREAS, the New York State Department of Labor in applying the PESH Act of 1980 (Public Employee Safety & Health Act) has issued a Notice of Violation and Order to Comply to the Town of Boston for their perceived safety violations and further if the repairs/restorations are not complete by December 16, 2016 the Town will be fined at the rate of \$200.00 per day until the repairs/restorations are complete and,

WHEREAS, the Garland/DBS, Inc. Company has submitted a proposal to complete the repairs/restorations for a total of \$133,954; to follow specifications as set forth by FEMA and to commence work immediately, and

WHEREAS, the Boston Town Board desires to exercise its authority under Article 6 subsection 2 of the Towns Procurement Policy adopted in January 2016 – Resolution 2016-1 to fore go the solicitations of any further quotation or proposals for the work to be performed because of the emergency circumstances.
