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Discussion ensued between Supervisor Ballowe and Highway Superintendent Telaak regarding construction at the end of Chestnut Lane.

Russell Goldberg, Chestnut Lane noted he received correspondence from the DEC in regards to his usage rights. He will get a copy of that letter to the Town Board. He also shared his surprise that per his FOIL request there has been no Soil removal or dumping permits issued since January 2011.

Supervisor Ballowe regretfully read a letter of resignation from Town Historian Keith Kaszubik.
