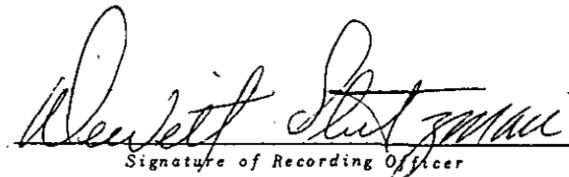

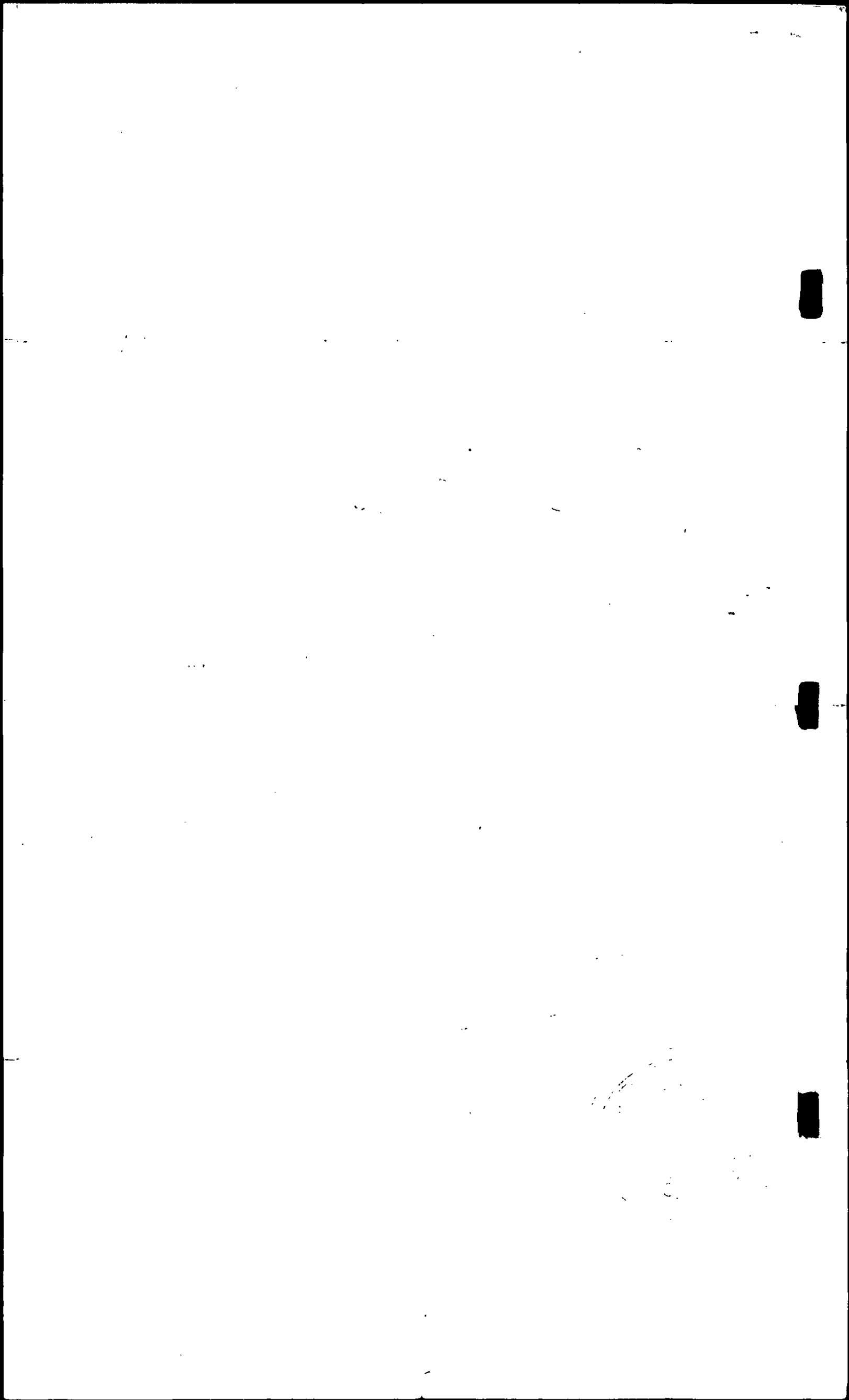

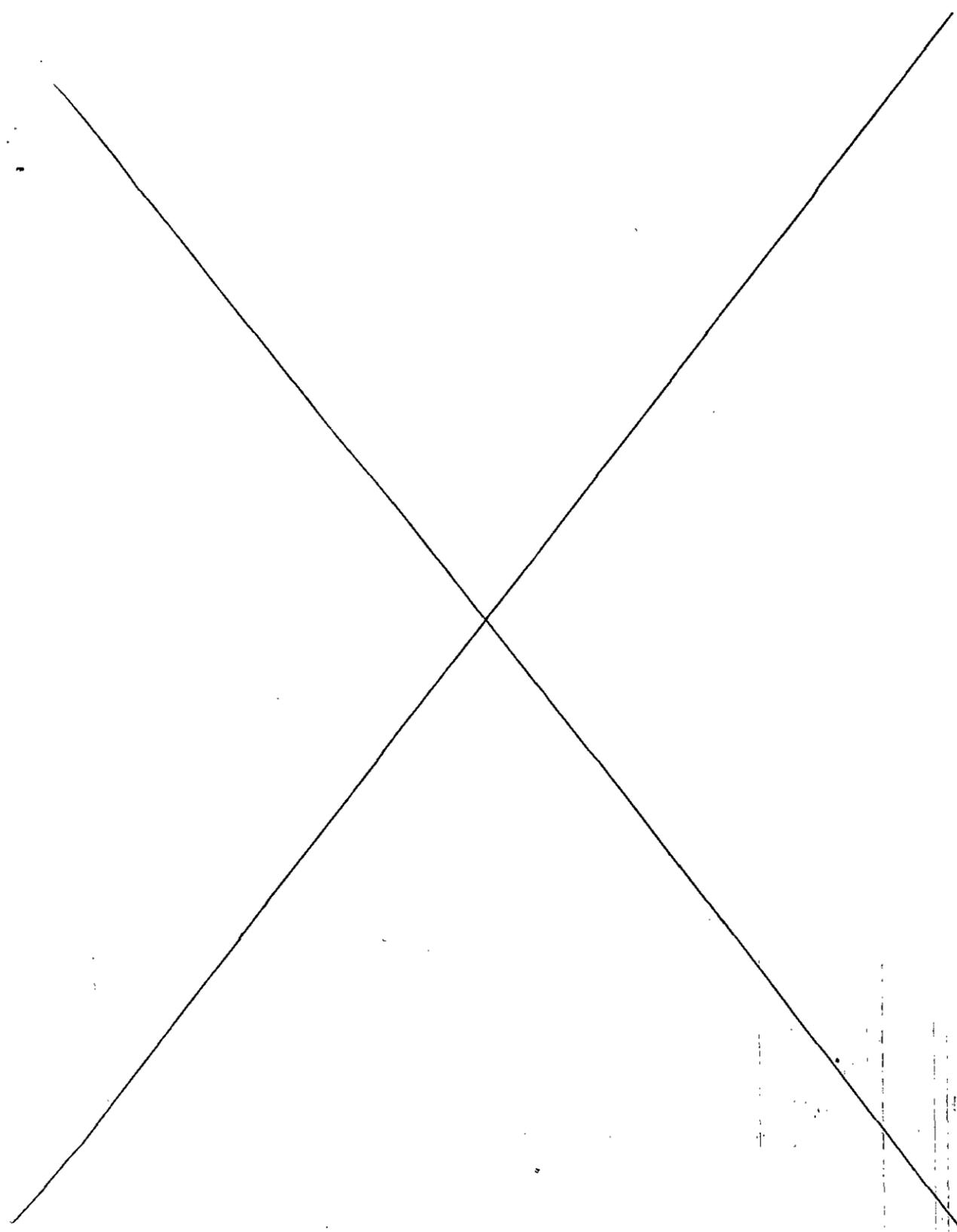

A motion was made by Councilman Schunk and seconded by Supervisor Fitzgerald that the contract from Bates Excavating Inc., as shown on the plans and specifications prepared by Mr. Moncreiff's office and the bid of \$9,203.55 be executed by Supervisor Fitzgerald on behalf of the Town of Boston for the emergency repair of Sewer District #2.

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A complaint from Richard J. Vogel, who owns property on Lower East Hill Road, regarding snowmobile owners using his property as a "thru-way" was read. Councilman Schunk stated that he would take this matter up with the Snowmobile Club and also that he would contact Mr. Vogel.

Mr. John Koza raised the question as to why water was never continued on Back Creek Road from Polish Hill Road to Pfarmer Road. The present Town Board could not tell Mr. Koza why this was not included when Water District #1 was formed. Supervisor Fitzgerald assured Mr. Koza that he would be notified of any future meetings that might be held in regard to forming new water districts.

Supervisor Fitzgerald announced that a joint meeting of the Planning Board and the Town Board will be held on either March 27th or 28th, 1968. Purpose of the meeting will be to discuss Zoning, Sub-divisions, Building Code and any other town business that might come up in the meantime.

A motion was made by Justice Tills and seconded by Councilman Schunk that Supervisor Fitzgerald be authorized to spend \$25.00 for dues for membership in the Association of Government.

This Amendment to the Zoning Ordinance shall take effect and be in force from and immediately after its passage, publication and posting or upon personal service of a certified copy thereof, as provided by law.

3. The following determinations are hereby made:

A. The period of probable usefulness of such highway is at least ten (10) years.

B. The subdivision of paragraph (a) of Section 11.00 of the Local Finance Law is applicable in the circumstances is Subdivision "20 (b)".

C. The proposed maturity of the obligations authorized by this resolution will not be in excess of ten (10) years.

4. That the Town of Boston, Erie County, New York, issue its serial bonds in the amount of \$5,100.00 to finance such cost in accordance with the financial plan herein set forth. Such bonds shall be dated and the power to fix and determine the exact date of such bonds is hereby delegated to the Supervisor.

5. Such bonds shall be numbered 1 through 10, inclusive, and shall be in the total amount of \$5,100.00 and shall mature in numerical order in annual installments in the years and amounts as follows: \$510.00 on April 1, 1970; \$510.00 on April 1, 1971; \$510.00 on April 1, 1972; \$510.00 on April 1, 1973; \$510.00 on April 1, 1974; \$510.00 on April 1, 1975; \$510.00 on April 1, 1976; \$510.00 on April 1, 1977; \$510.00 on April 1, 1978 and \$510.00 on April 1, 1979.
